REASONS:

- 1. What is the issue the discussion topic or proposal is trying to address? This proposal shows our commitment to girls' physical and mental health among the highest priorities of our movement. As Girl Scouts, we promise to live by the law and this would include girls' health among our most important priorities.
- 2. Are there other ways to address this issue? Including a focus on health in the law demonstrates a commitment and focus beyond programming and marketing; it needs to be more than a pillar of the movement that may change over time. The way to make girl's health a permanent priority is to add it to the law.
- 3. How does this proposal improve Movement governance or policy? OR How does this discussion topic inform Movement strategy? Including girls' health in the Girl Scout law allows our Movement to proclaim this priority and use it as the foundation for health focused data collection, programing, fundraising, and lobbying on behalf of girls.
- 4. Does this agenda item have Movement-wide significance? Does it apply to all councils? Yes, this proposal applies to all Girl Scouts in all councils.
- 5. Is this agenda item time-sensitive? What happens if it is not addressed at NCS 58? Girls' mental and physical health is one of the most urgent issues facing girls in the U.S. today. As a Movement, we cannot proclaim to be the voice of girls and to best understand know girls' unique needs if we are ignoring their physical and mental health.
