Amend the Timing of a Special National Council Session Notification

STATEMENT OF PROPOSAL OR DISCUSSION TOPIC, QUESTION, OR ISSUE (Proposals should be written in the form of a motion)

THAT the Constitution of Girl Scouts of the United States of America, Article V – Sessions of the National Council, Section 3 – Special Sessions, Paragraph 3 be amended from 30 days notification to 45 days such that Paragraph 3 reads as follows:

Notice of the special session, stating the time, place, and specific purpose, shall be mailed or delivered electronically not less than 30 45 days before the session to each local council, each delegate from USA Girl Scouts Overseas, each member of the National Board of Directors and the National Board Development Committee, each Past President, and each member elected by the National Council who is entitled to vote at such session. **Proposals for the special session shall also be included in the notice.**

REASONS:

- 1. What is the issue the discussion topic or proposal is trying to address?
- 2. Are there other ways to address this issue?
- 3. How does this proposal improve Movement governance or policy? OR How does this discussion topic inform Movement strategy?

The Special 57th National Council Session in October 2024 was the first execution of this clause added during the 56th National Council Session in July 2023. During the preparation for the 57th NCS there were additional challenges faced by the delegations not typically faced during the triennial NCS preparation.

- Girl delegates were engaged in school during the 30 days.
- Requests for information by the NCS body accelerated the response timeline from the National Board and GSUSA staff.
- Delegate information and education sessions were on an accelerated basis and involved complex business and financial understanding.
- Delegations had very little time to obtain input from their Council members after understanding the scope themselves.

The purpose of the addition of this clause was to allow the NCS to move quickly for critical issues that required the full National Council body prior to the standard triennial schedule. However, the accelerated schedule of 30 days generated significant stress and challenges for the delegation, the National Board, and GSUSA staff. Delegates were occupied with work and school and information and education sessions were perceived as rushed. The complex topics of finances and business acumen required education of delegates not already familiar with these concepts and documents, especially Girl delegates already carrying their standard academic load.

A change of 30 days to 45 days would allow an extra 2 weeks for delegations to prepare and obtain input and feedback from their members, particularly when the scope of the Special Session involves proposals that can elicit emotional responses and are very complex.

An amendment of 30 days to 60 days was considered. Doubling the preparation time would counter the intended goal of addressing a critical time-sensitive issue. Therefore, 45 days is a compromise that provides additional preparation time while maintaining a balance of timing.

FINANCIAL IMPACT STATEMENT FOR PROPOSALS

The Council is not able to quantitatively calculate exact financial figures. The qualitative positive impacts of this change are:

- Potential reduction in overtime for GSUSA staff with more time for preparation.
- Reduced travel cost / meeting costs for National Delegates meeting with their Council
 membership for education and feedback gathering, as extra time means less rush fees and
 possibly an opportunity for more delegates to participate.
- Reduced stress for GSUSA staff, National Board, and National Delegates with more time to understand and analyze the provided data and prepare for debate.
