Juliette Gordon Low founded Girl Scouts in Savannah, GA in 1912. Her house is now a historic site and is currently owned by GSUSA. Many troops from around the country visit Savannah and the Birthplace every year.

Girl Scouts are encouraged to travel with their troop, with our council programs, and through opportunities offered by GSUSA called *Destinations*. -VISIT Options-

-VISIT a historic building in your hometown. In Savannah there are historical buildings all around.

-VISIT a fort. Savannah has two forts named Fort Pulaski and Fort Jackson. Find a fort online and take a virtual tour.

-VISIT a historical house of worship. The First African Baptist Church was the first church built and used by African Americans (many of them slaves) for worship.

-VISIT a local park. Savannah has many beautiful parks with water features, trees and plants that grow there.

-VISIT a local monument or statue. Savannah has famous monuments like The Waving Girl and the Bird Girl.

-VISIT a “haunted” building. Savannah is considered the second most haunted city in the United States.

-LEARN Options-

-LEARN about a famous restaurant in Savannah. Choose from either the Olde Pink House, the Pirate House, or Lady and Sons. Pick a restaurant you would want to eat at, find their website and choose a meal off the menu.

-LEARN about Savannah's public transportation system called CAT. The CAT takes travelers to many places around the city for free. Find out if your city has public transportation too.

-LEARN about the lighthouse at Tybee Island and how that was important to the coastal area of Georgia.

-LEARN about the Juliette Gordon Low Birthplace and find out how to schedule a tour.

-LEARN about GSCCS Travel Group and Destinations and how you can visit Savannah with other Girl Scouts in your council.

-LEARN about Savannah's history in the United States Civil War. Find out why Savannah was important to the South during that time.
