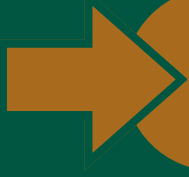
Keep a troop roster of girls' names and caregiver contact information alongside girls' meeting attendance and earned badges.

The Girl Scout Leadership Experience

What makes Girl Scouts truly unique? Everything is designed especially for, and is tested by, girls! Our program centers around our research-backed Girl Scout Leadership Experience—that is, what girls do and how they do it. Activities are girl-led, which gives girls opportunities to explore leadership roles and “learn by doing” in a cooperative-learning environment.

In Girl Scouts, girls will:

Discover: Every activity girls tackle in Girl Scouts helps them discover who they are, what they care about, and what their talents are.

Connect: Girls collaborate with and learn from other people and expand their horizons. This helps them care about and inspire others locally and globally.

Take Action: As girls connect with and show care for others, they become eager to take action to make the world a better place.

So what does this mean for your troop? Through Girl Scouting, your girls will develop a strong sense of self, demonstrate positive values, seek challenges, solve significant problems in her community, and establish healthy relationships. These aren't just good qualities—they're leadership skills for a lifetime!

What is the Girl Scout Program?

No matter what excites your girls, they'll find engaging and fun activities in the four areas that make up the core of the Girl Scout program:



STEM

Computer science, engineering, robotics, outdoor STEM, and more.



Outdoors

Adventure and Skill building building, from the backyard to the backcountry, including through camping experiences for all ages.



Life Skills

Civic engagement, healthy living, global citizenship, communication skills—to name a few.



Entrepreneurship

The Girl Scout Cookie Program—the largest girl-led entrepreneurial program in the world—teaches goal setting, decision making, money management, business ethics, and people skills.

Whether they complete Girl Scout Leadership Journeys, earn badges, unleash their inner entrepreneur through the Girl Scout Cookie Program, pack for their first hike, change the world through “Take Action” projects, or any combination of these activities, at Girl Scouts, every girl has countless ways to explore our four program areas and hone the skills they'll need to power a lifetime of success—whatever that looks like for them.

As your girls progress through Girl Scouts, they'll learn to take the reins and make their Girl Scout experiences their own—it's what being girl-led is all about! And as a leader, you'll encourage them to dream big and challenge themselves as they take their newfound passions to the next level.

While program elements—like outdoor expeditions and entrepreneurial ventures—align across all grade levels, Girl Scout Daisies and Brownies won't be doing the same activities as seasoned Seniors and Ambassadors. But by building on the knowledge and skills they gain year after year, your girls' confidence will grow exponentially and they'll be eager to take those next steps.



DAISIES
K & 1ST

Girl Scout Daisies sparkle with that first-time newness in everything they do. They go on trips, learn about nature and science, and explore the arts and their communities—and so much more. Daisies can also earn learning petals.



BROWNIES
2ND & 3RD

Girl Scout Brownies work together as they earn badges and explore their communities. Friendship, fun, and age-appropriate activities begin at the Girl Scout Brownie meeting and move out to the community. While earning badges, Brownies build skills and explore passions!



JUNIORS
4TH & 5TH

Girl Scout Juniors are big-idea thinkers. They're explorers at camp and product designers when they earn their Innovation and Storytelling badges, or even their Bronze Award. Every day, they wake up ready to play a new role.



CADETTES
6TH - 8TH

Girl Scout Cadettes chart their own courses and let their curiosity and imagination lead the way. They learn about the power of being a good friend, gain confidence by mentoring younger girls, and can earn their Silver Award.



SENIORS
9TH & 10TH

Girl Scout Seniors are ready to take the world by storm, and Girl Scouts gives them countless ways to do it. Their experiences shape their world, while giving them a safe space to be themselves. Seniors can earn their Gold Award and change the world in a tangible, lasting way.



AMBASSADORS
11TH & 12TH

Girl Scout Ambassadors know that small acts produce big change. While they get ready for life beyond high school, Girl Scouts helps them take flight. They can also earn their Gold Award and drive lasting impact in their communities.

All of the skills and experiences girls gain throughout their time in Girl Scouts set them up for special recognition through the Bronze, Silver, and Gold Awards. Through their award projects, your girls will tackle issues close to their hearts and make a real difference—and if they decide to pursue their Gold Award, they'll also be eligible for unique college scholarships and open doors to promising career opportunities. The longer your girls are in Girl Scouts, the brighter their futures will be—and they'll have you to thank for it!

Funding Girl Scout Troop Adventures

If your girls have big ideas to include in their Girl Scout adventures, you may have questions about how to fund it. In Girl Scouts, we have several opportunities for troops to earn funds to fuel their dreams and encourage volunteers to let girls take age-appropriate roles in setting budgets and funding activities!



Troop Dues

Many troops decide to collect troop dues to help provide startup funds for activities and supplies. The decision is up to each troop and typically covers badges, supplies, and a field trip.

Fall Product Program

Troops can learn entrepreneurship skills and earn early proceeds for troop activities in the Fall Product Program. Encourage girls to set up their online store, avatar, and sell to families.

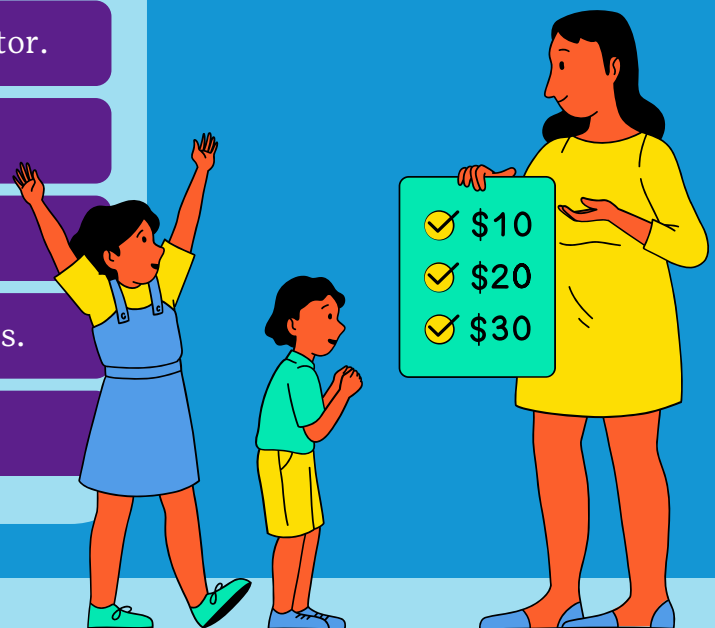


Girl Scout Cookie Program

All troops participate in the Girl Scout Cookie Program - the largest entrepreneurship training experience for girls in the country. Girls will not only earn funds to complete their Girl Scout goals, but also learn life-changing skills that our research shows sets girls up for success later in life.

Get prepared for the Girl Scout Cookie Program:

- ☐ Find a volunteer to serve as Cookie Coordinator.
- ☐ New Troops: Set up a troop bank account.
- ☐ Schedule a girl goal setting meeting.
- ☐ Schedule a parent meeting to set expectations.

Our #1 Priority: Keeping Girls Safe

As a troop volunteer, our first priority is ensuring girls stay safe while having fun and learning new skills. From troop meetings to cookie booths to camping weekends, adult volunteers must always be present in order to properly supervise girl activities. The help chart below breaks down the minimum number of volunteers needed to supervise various activities.



What is a Certified Adult Volunteer?

Membership & Training

All Girl Scout volunteers must become an adult member of Girl Scouts and complete Mandated Reporter Training.

LiveScan Background Check

All Girl Scout volunteers in the state of California must pass a LiveScan Background Check in order to work alongside youth.

A Girl Scout Troop should afford girls the opportunity to LEAD, which also decreases the responsibility of adult volunteers. Allow girls to provide input and vote on troop decisions like badges for the year, field trips, and goals for the Fall Product and Cookie Program. Troops also run best when girls have responsibilities - in Girl Scouts, we assign this division of tasks in a Kaper Chart.

Running Your Girl Scout Troop | Council Events

Our research shows that girls are more likely to have an enriching, enjoyable experience in Girl Scouting if their experience expands outside of a troop meeting. That's why we provide thousands of spots at low-cost, council-led events. Our goal is to remove the burden from troop leaders to help girls earn every badge on their wish-list, and also bring girls together from across the council to build relationships.



Paying for Council Events

At GSCCS, we're committed to ensuring girls have access to our program regardless of a family's financial situation. That's why we have multiple ways for families and troops to fund events:

New Troop Welcome Box

New troops receive a Welcome Box with \$15 in Program Credits to ensure new girls have access to events.

Early Bird Renewal

Members who renew their membership by September 30 receive \$15 in Program Credits.

Fall Product & Cookie Program

Troops can earn proceeds, Nut Bucks, and Cookie Dough to spend on GSCCS events.

Troop Dues or Parent Pay

Troops charge families dues to cover the cost of events or families may pay for event fees directly online.

- If necessary, enter additional information such as sessions, dietary restrictions, or special needs for each member.

Pay and Checkout

Choose Payment Method.

- Select the appropriate payment method for each participant.
- NOTE: Free events still require a payment method for registration.
- After adding all event participants, click [Submit Member Details](#).
- Accept the Girl Scout Promise and Law, enter payment details, and click [Submit Payment](#).
- A receipt will be sent via email after registration!

Girl Scout Troop Roster & Attendance

Use the roster to keep an easy list of each girl and their primary guardian name and phone number for easy access. Remember, troop leaders should also keep a girl's completed Annual Permission Slip and Health History on hand for every troop activity in case of emergencies. List each troop meeting topic and badge to then check off attendance and track if girls complete the badge to distribute at the meeting or later in the troop year!

Troop Meeting Management

As girls set goals to accomplish for the year, adult volunteers can schedule those badges or activities into troop meetings, field trips, and council events. For troop meetings, divide up responsibilities for planning that meeting between a group of girls and volunteers, ask support for providing snacks, and assign girls responsibilities to run the meeting!

Troop Meeting Management

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Girl Scout Finance Tracking

Girl Scouts is often the first opportunity for girls to plan a budget, make decisions, and track money in order to accomplish their goals. Troops must track all income and troop expenses and allow girls to hold age-appropriate jobs to assist in finance tracking. Use the tracker below to keep notes on income and expenses each month in order to prepare for annual finance reports due on June 30.
